Kentucky Lake Section of the American Chemical Society (KLS-ACS) and Murray State University Student Members of the American Chemical Society (MSU-SMACS) jointly sponsored multiple events during the week of Earth Day Celebrations.

Dr. Bommanna Loganathan, Professor of Chemistry and Coordinator for Chemists Celebrate Earth Day (CCED) organized illustrated poem contest for K-12 students in the regional schools.
